Re: Announcing Community Forum, March 2, 2010

Following the arrest of a student last week at Regenstein Library, a number of students and community members have raised concerns about library protocol, how police become involved in incidents on campus, and relations between police and students. We take those concerns seriously.

As with any event of this nature, University leadership is thoroughly reviewing the situation on multiple levels, to understand the facts and how to move forward. Last week members of Campus and Student Life staff convened several small meetings with the most affected students and staff members as part of that review.

This Tuesday, March 2, from 6-8 pm, Student Government and Campus and Student Life will host a campus community forum to take place in the McCormick Tribune Lounge at the Reynolds Club. We invite members of the campus community to join us, to express their views, and to help develop ideas for maintaining the kind of community that supports all of us. Representatives of Campus and Student Life, the College, the University of Chicago Police Department, and the Regenstein Library will be present.

Engaged community members are an important part of the University of Chicago's commitment to rigorous inquiry, and we look forward to continuing the dialogue.
